READER'S WORKSHOP

Reader's Workshop - meets students at their current reading level and enables them to improve or enhance their reading by choosing "just right" books. Specific skills and researched based reading strategies are presented and practiced to promote literacy. Role-playing, reader's theater, and oral presentations are also important parts of the workshop.

WRITER'S WORKSHOP

Writer's Workshop gives students the opportunity to learn how to write for specific purposes. Narratives, descriptive writing, poetry and reading responses are some of the different kinds of writings worked on each day.

WORD STUDY

Word Study is another component of literacy. Depending on the age level, students will learn to use and manipulate sounds, letters, endings and beginnings to create words and learn new vocabulary.

NUMBER TALKS

Number Talks which helps students develop computational fluency as they use number relationships and the structures of numbers to add, subtract, multiply and divide as appropriate to their age.

LOGICAL/ MATHEMATICAL THINKING

Logical/Mathematical Thinking with manipulatives help learners to create their own math understandings by investigating different ways to apply math concepts.

MATH WORKSHOP

Math Workshop helps target specific instructional needs of each learner whether it be the need for enrichment or skill reinforcement. Different problems or tasks that use strategy work and math conversations are part of this everyday math experience. Number patterns, geometry, fractions, and algorithms are some of the areas presented.

COMPUTERS AND IPADS

Computers and iPads are available in classrooms for word processing blogging, educational games, and internet use for research purposes.

ART

Art is naturally integrated into the day.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PE)

Physical Education (PE) is a daily activity. Students can enhance motor skills while participating in physical games, variety of sports.

ENGLISH AS ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE

English as Additional Language (EAL) classes are available for those students who are learning English. Students are in the regular classroom with their peers for most of the day, but will have direct English instruction for part of the day by a certified EAL teacher.
